I believe the current (initial) plans presented are concerning for the following reasons Proposal to use Wattie 2 (junior oval) as an overflow car park for special events. We feel that an overflow car park could significantly damage the playing surface of Wattie 2 and impact our ability to use this space for our younger teams. This is an essential part of our club's current and future requirements. The existing plans also have the Elwood Tennis Club sharing space with the Elwood Croquet Club and expanding that footprint which in turn reduces the Wattie 2 available playing surface. This is a major concern as our club could not manage to provide opportunities for all our children to play without Wattie 2. There has been no mention of an upgrade of the Wattie Watson pavilion. We are committed to working towards pavilion upgrades, the primary objective being the addition of female-only change rooms and toilets. We are also seeking to increase the footprint of the pavilion to allow the Club and its co-tenants the ability to hold club events at this facility and 'future proof' for future growth. 	<p>Is there anything else you'd like to share with us about the proposed site plan?</p>	<p>I strongly disagree with the proposal to relocate Elwood Tennis club, make it a combined sports facility, and replace the current site with car parking.</p> <p>The history of the club, the suitability of the proposed new location, and the club's vital role in the community appear to have been inadequately researched. Particularly as the new location and planned facilities seem inappropriate. Key concerns</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The proposed relocation could see some of the courts located close to the noisy and very busy intersection of Beach Rd & St Kilda St. That could be dangerous to road traffic and club members (particularly for stray balls that get accidentally hit out of courts). - The land allocation for the courts appears to be inadequate at the proposed site which could compromise the club's suitability for play - including competition club tennis. - There's no option for additional courts in the design (despite the club having a waiting list of over 125 people - with few other options for tennis in the area). - The proposal to replace the existing club site with yet more car parking contradicts your Council's stated aim of minimising the impact of car parking. <p>The proposed new location on Head Street can be extremely busy and congested in the summer months, which would create parking issues for tennis club members. There seems to have been no consideration given to the long history of the club on the current site (I believe it's been providing tennis to the community since the 1930s in its current location).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Necessary screening (including trees/shrubbery for privacy, traffic noise reduction and wind buffering appear to be inadequate in the proposed new site). - Elwood tennis club has a unique social atmosphere (which would be compromised by making this a combined sports facility with shared clubhouse). - No clear timescale has been provided. It's important to note that Elwood Tennis Club provides a vital role in providing physical and mental health benefits and social connections for its membership. Any disruption/delays caused by a relocation would be detrimental to hundreds of people of all ages who rely on the tennis and the club for physical, mental, and social wellbeing. - It seems to be an unnecessary expenditure to relocate a long-standing, existing sports club (which actually has great facilities) and replace it with car parking.

30502 Feb 01, 2022, 12 26 PM	<p>Is there anything else you'd like to share with us about the proposed site plan?</p>	<p>To Port Phillip Council</p> <p>I am a longtime Elwood resident writing to object to the proposed Foreshore Plan.</p> <p>My principal objection is the relocation of the existing Elwood Tennis Club to accommodate a car park. Relocating a long established and much-loved sporting facility appears to negate the plans first two guiding principles of having "Public open space, recreational activities and events and ... positive community benefit".</p> <p>The proposed new site next to the croquet club is too small to comfortably fit in the four tennis courts, not to forget that the croquet club wants to extend their club house which will further reduce space.</p> <p>The Elwood Tennis Club is a very popular community club with a long membership waiting list. Membership wait times could be reduced and accessibility to facilities enhanced by extending the existing location and installing two new tennis courts on the south side of the tennis club where there is available land space. The membership waiting list indicates the Elwood community wants and needs more recreational space, not less.</p> <p>The tennis courts are constantly in use. I play on them up to three times a week between 8am-8pm, and the other courts are also occupied during these times. It is a very popular local facility that is unique to Elwood in so much as it is not a commercial tennis centre run privately for capital gain, but instead it is a community club used by local Elwood residents.</p> <p>The existing car park between the Tennis club and the beach is used minimally and is almost never even close to being half full. This probably indicates that the foreshore is primarily use by local residents who arrive at the foreshore on foot or by bicycle. On those rare very hot days during summer there is a demand for parking, usually on weekends. as people from across greater Melbourne visit the bayside beaches, on those odd days of high demand no amount of car spaces will accommodate the sudden influx of cars.</p> <p>During peak time, or even all year round, the council could provide a public transport shuttle bus along Ormond Esplanade, one that stops at several of the bayside beaches including Elwood beach.</p> <p>In regard to the bike path, as a long time commuting cyclist, I can attest that the bike path along the foreshore is one of the better function cycle ways in Melbourne. In relation to the Foreshore Plan I believe it is a case of if it isn't broken, don't fix it.</p> <p>Interestingly on the proposed site map the proposed car park, where the existing tennis club is, is not labelled car park. All other structures are clearly labelled however the car park is not.</p> <p>After attending the online Q&A session on 29/01/22 I understand council is at the preliminary stage of a potential ten-year plan. I hope you closely consider the community feedback and some of my suggestions and rethink the proposed building of a car park on one of the real jewels of the Elwood community, the oasis that is the Elwood Tennis Club.</p>	None	No

	<p>Is there anything else you'd like to share with us about the proposed site plan?</p> <p>I live at [REDACTED]</p> <p>In general, I understand and support most of the recommendations in the site plan.</p> <p>Key points that I object to, and which should be reconsidered are</p> <p>1)Construction of a new road to the sports pavilion accessed via Head Street. This road is planned to be [REDACTED] where there is currently a line of trees and natural vegetation.</p> <p>2)The addition of parallel parking encroaching on to the current sports ovals with the potential loss of the current line of young trees.</p> <p>My recommendations to overcome these 2 objections are</p> <p>1.Access to the sport pavilion to remain unchanged, or via Ormond Esplanade and not via Head St.</p> <p>2.Increasing the currently existing parking and/or utilizing space close to existing car park (for example the addition of a new car park closer to Ormond Road conveniently positioned between the football and soccer field with access road to sports pavilion). Head St is a quiet no through road residential street. Materially increasing the traffic in this street through both access to the sport pavilion and the addition of parallel parking will result in Head St becoming more congested than it already is.</p> <p>Residents currently look out over well-utilized and enjoyed sports fields, not a car park. It is common for balls to roll on to Head St, often being retrieved by young children. Having more cars parking on the oval side and travelling down Head St to the pavilion, will naturally increase the risk of accidents occurring, as you won't be able to see kids coming from between cars.</p> <p>Happy to discuss.</p>

It sends the message that it's OK to get to the foreshore using your private car—it's simply not. Given that this project is partly driven by the necessity of dealing with consequences of climate change, encouraging more driving to the detriment of public transport and active travel is an unfortunate message to be sending in 2022. One of the goal of this site plan is facilitating movement, but it appears little consideration has been given to improving the connection between the foreshore and Ormond Rd activity centre. For example, making crossing the Ormond Esplanade on foot safer and easier by significantly lowering speeds on the Esplanade, reducing car traffic by improving public transport connectivity, and raising all the crosswalks all seem like low hanging fruits. Extending the network of protected cycle tracks all the way to Ormond Rd. would also help. Additionally, another goal of the plan is to stimulate Economic activity, it appears that some of the space could be used for fresh produce and/or craft market-type activities, or host small community-driven shops. This massive development will remove many mature coastal banksia trees and will degrade the coastal environment and gardens that are the pride of local ratepayers and have taken decades of careful management to establish and maintain. The street cannot cope with any additional traffic movement whatsoever. The intersection at Head and St Kilda Street is extremely dangerous with vehicles regularly running through red lights (mostly north bound). The concept of relocating the tennis courts is unacceptable in the proposed location and presents significant dangers for children and adults at the nearby intersection as it would become the main conduit for Elwood residents. The proposed adjacent car park and overflow car parking is also unacceptable due to the needs of both the cricket, junior football, soccer, and touch rugby clubs. Grounds are scarce and use of the small oval is critical across clubs year round. Elwood beach is crowded enough without inviting more traffic movement / visitation from outer suburbs. The proposal is also an extraordinarily poor use of scarce CoPP funds. The best community and economic solution is to spend the capital on the StKilda Triangle and leave Elwood alone - with the exception of improved planting and a reduction of car spaces. The other alternative position for car parking at Elwood foreshore is behind Pt Ormond. Vehicle movement is significantly better and there is little direct impact to residents. The area, including the bushes between the service road and Ormond Esp, needs cleaning up with better safety measures and security patrolling.
