2,152 people received specialist homelessness services in **2021- 22.**














'Priority access' preferences on Victorian Housing Register, by broadband area, June 2022




Clients of Specialist Homelessness Services in Port Phillip












Specialist Homelessness Services (SHS) agencies receive government funding to deliver SHS services to clients. A client is any person who receives a direct service from SHS agencies - they may be homeless or at risk of homelessness. The AIHW receives and aggregates data from around 1,600 specialist homelessness services agencies across Australia on a monthly basis.

In the year to June 2022, the number of new private rental lettings fell by -175, or -8.2%.







Private rental affordability in Port Phillip



In the year to June 2022 quarter, 89 private rental lettings were affordable to lower income households, which account for 1.0 % of total private lettings.





Note: The assessment of affordable supply is based on the number of suitably-sized properties that are no more than 30 per cent of gross income for low-income households. Lower income households are defined as those receiving Centrelink incomes.
