Additional information

There are 49 people active on the Port Phillip By Name List (BNL), which is 2 less than last month. Of the 49 people currently active on BNL, 31 were sleeping rough (including in squats and vehicles); 12 identified as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and 6 people were over 55.

The Rough Sleepers Initiative (RSI) has reported contact with 41 individual people experiencing rough sleeping homelessness in Port Phillip in October 2024. RSI assertive outreach workers delivered 100 episodes of contact in 55 hours directly working with these people.

Council continues to support a coordinated response to Rough Sleeping homelessness. This involves Council's Housing and Homelessness services, City Amenity and Indigenous Policy and partnering with community organisations and Police.
