## Additional information

There are 55 people active on the Port Phillip By Name List (BNL), which is 4 less than last month. Of the 55 people currently active on the BNL, 28 were sleeping rough (including in squats and vehicles); 10 were Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People and 12 people were over 55.

The Rough Sleepers Initiative (RSI ) has reported contact with 20 individual people experiencing rough sleeping homelessness in Port Phillip in February 2024. RSI assertive outreach workers delivered 89 episodes of contact in 10 hours directly working with these people.
