Footpath Trading - Fact Sheet Delineation Markers



What are Delineation Markers?


Delineation markers are small silver discs located on the footpath surface. The discs measure 60mm in diameter and define the required pedestrian zone within the streets of the City Of Port Phillip.

Delineation markers will be evenly spaced along footpaths where footpath trading furniture has been permitted under the Council's Local Law No. I and Council's Footpath Trading Guidelines (2017).

Why Are Delineation Markers Required?

The objective of the markers is to create a visual aid to clearly define the adequate pedestrian zone required under the Guidelines to ensure a safe and unobstructed passage to meet the needs of all community members.

By providing this clear distinction, permit-holders and staff are can more easily set up furniture and comply with their permit. This visual also assists Local Laws officers who proactively patrol our city to ensure footpaths remain unobstructed and approved furniture does not encroach into the pedestrian zone.



Installation

Delineation markers will be installed throughout the municipality. Each permit-holder will be notified before installation occurs.

The delineation markers will be installed flush with the footpath surface. It is estimated to take approximately 30 minutes per business to install markers, depending upon the length of the building frontage and the number of markers required.

Any disruption resulting from the installation of the delineation markers will be kept to a minimum.




Diagram - Footpath Trading Zones

Maintenance

The delineation markers are hard-wearing and provide a long-term solution to managing patrons and pedestrian accessibility. If any future works occur such as upgrading of a footpaths surface, any replacement delineation markers will be installed without any additional charge to the permit-holder.

Costs

The cost of the markers will be charged back to the permit-holder as required by the Footpath Trading Guidelines (2017). A one-off payment to cover the purchase will be requested after installation.
