From the Chamber

Community safety continues to be a high priority for our Council so I want to share a notice of motion that was passed unanimously in our Council Chamber last week.

Essentially, it involves Council officers investigating suggested changes to our local law relating to people experiencing homelessness. This reflects community and traders' concerns about encampments in public places, which has been associated with anti-social and criminal activity and left some in our community feeling unsafe.



It's fair to say there were diverse views, for and against, among some Councillors and members of the public about this proposal. I want to stress that what we agreed to is a review only – and this investigation will be aligned to the upcoming broader roundtable we have convened on community safety.

Following my letter to the Chief Commissioner, we are sitting down formally with Victoria Police from this week to discuss a range of matters including how these potential local law changes might work and if there are implications we should be aware of. This working group will include the Local Area Commander.

We will also be hearing ideas and feedback from local experts ranging from Victoria Police to health and housing outreach services and legal centres at the roundtable as community safety is complex and requires everyone to work together.

While community safety is rightly a priority, our recent two-day St Kilda Festival was a timely reminder that St Kilda has so much to offer. I'm proud to report that the Festival was another huge success, attracting 350,000 music lovers on Big Festival Sunday alone and with great performances, despite challenging windy conditions, at First Peoples First.

The fun continues with this issue of Divercity featuring a range of upcoming events, many of them free. I invite everyone to come along, whether it's munching on mussels, enjoying live music while the Australian Grand Prix revs up or perusing a fantastic display of Porsches.

We-Akon Dilinja dawns in St Kilda

About 120 Port Phillip residents from 41 countries became Australian citizens on 26 January at a citizenship ceremony at the St Kilda Town Hall.



There was a sense of excitement as conferees were presented with their citizenship, along with a wattle pin and a native Australian plant. A performance by the Low Rez choir and a sausage sizzle outside on the lawns added to the celebratory atmosphere.

Elwood resident Linda Drechsel travelled to Melbourne in 2016 for a marketing internship. Nearly nine years to the day of her arrival, she's now an Australian citizen, celebrating the day with close friends at a local pub.

Linda shared her love for Elwood – the suburb she now calls home. "I enjoy being able to walk down to the beach and go for a swim in summer. It's something I never would have been able to do if I still lived in Germany," she said.

Fellow conferee and former Ireland resident, Stephen Boland also moved to Port Phillip in 2016 with his partner.

After spending time living in Gippsland and Essendon, Stephen was ultimately drawn back to St Kilda thanks to its strong cultural ties to his homeland.

"Of course, a lot of Irish people live around St Kilda and Port Phillip. We quickly made friends here and every weekend we found ourselves coming back to St Kilda to catch up with our friends," he said.

Annual Community Satisfaction Survey coming soon

During March and April, we're conducting our annual Community Satisfaction Survey to better understand our community's experience with our services and facilities as well as other issues of concern in the City of Port Phillip.

In the past, the survey was conducted by computer assisted telephone interview. This year, Metropolis Research will conduct the survey face-to-face. Personal details and individual responses are confidential and only the overall results are shared with City of Port Phillip.

The survey methodology is to interview 900 residents across our municipality and may take 12-15 minutes to complete. Our researchers will have identification and introduce themselves to you. We encourage you to view their ID and they will have with them a signed authority letter advising the survey is not a scam.



New timeslot for document signing centre

There has been a change to the Justices of the Peace document signing service at the Victorian Pride Centre, originally reported in the November edition of Divercity.



The free service has switched from Sundays to between noon and 4 pm on Saturdays, excluding public holiday weekends. This is the only community-based Document Signing Centre within a 10 km radius of Melbourne's CBD that isn't a police station.

Over two months, 14 volunteer JPs serviced over 120 clients and signed over important 650 documents at the DSC@VPC.
