Additional information

There are 57 people active on the Port Phillip By Name List (BNL), which is 2 more than last month. Of the 57 people currently active on the BNL, 25 were sleeping rough(including in squats and vehicles) ; 11 were Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People and 11 people were over 55. The Rough Sleepers Initiative (RSI) has reported contact with 28 individual people experiencing rough sleeping homelessness in Port Phillip in March 2024. RSI assertive outreach workers delivered 104 episodes of contact in 12.5 hours directly working with these people. Council continues to support a coordinated response to Rough Sleeping homelessness. This involves Council's Housing and Homelessness, City Amenity and Indigenous Policy partnering with community organisations and Police. Council's Housing & Homelessness Services also delivered 78 hours of assistance to 65 older individuals at risk of, or experiencing homelessness and assisted 8 people to be housed
