

# Foreshore dog regulations



Your dog must be put on leash before leaving the sand, and must be on leash by default in all areas of Port Phillip (including parks, reserves and pathways) unless signed otherwise. Penalties apply for failing to adhere to restrictions. **From 1 April to 31 October, dogs are allowed on all beaches.**

**⚠ Dogs must be under effective control at all times.**

## Restrictions apply from 1 November to 31 March:

### Sandridge Beach

- DOG OFF-LEASH AREA** Dogs allowed off-leash on sand between the rock groyne opposite Barak Road and the rock groyne opposite Cumberland Road.
- NO DOG ZONE** Dogs cannot go on sand anywhere else on Sandridge Beach.

### Port Melbourne Beach

- DOG OFF-LEASH AREA** Dogs allowed off-leash on sand between Port Melbourne Yacht Club and Lagoon Pier.
- NO DOG ZONE** Dogs cannot go on sand anywhere else on Port Melbourne Beach.

### South Melbourne Beach

- NO DOG ZONE** Dogs cannot go on sand.

### Middle Park Beach

- RESTRICTIONS APPLY** Dogs allowed off-leash on sand 7.30 pm to 10 am between Kerferd Road Pier and Langridge Street.
- Dogs cannot go on sand outside this time or this location.

### St Kilda West

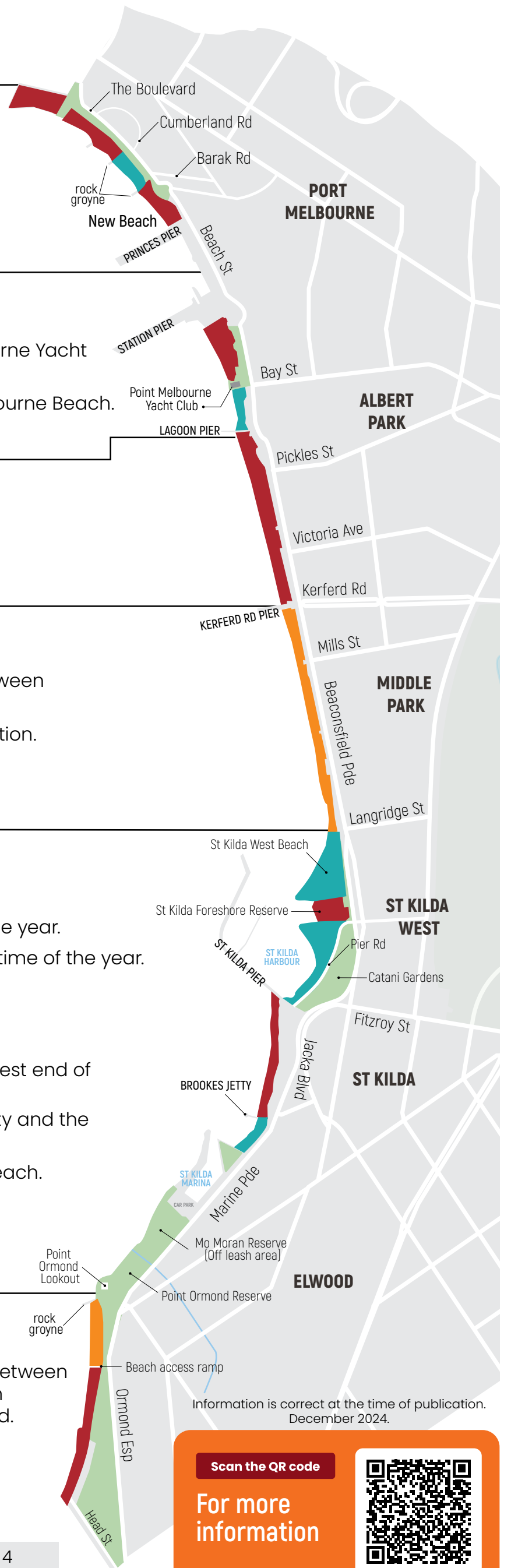
- DOG OFF-LEASH AREA** Year-round dog beach. Dogs are welcome off-leash on sand at all times of the year.
- NO DOG ZONE** Dogs cannot go on St Kilda Foreshore Reserve at any time of the year.

### St Kilda Beach

- DOG OFF-LEASH AREA** Dogs allowed off-leash on sand between the north-west end of Pier Road and St Kilda Pier. Dogs allowed off-leash on sand between Brookes Jetty and the northern end of the St Kilda Marina car park.
- NO DOG ZONE** Dogs cannot go on sand anywhere else on St Kilda Beach.

### Elwood Beach

- RESTRICTIONS APPLY** Dogs allowed off-leash on sand 5.30 am to 9.30 am between the rock groyne south of Point Ormond and the beach access ramp 35 metres south-east of Normandy Road.
- NO DOG ZONE** Dogs cannot go on sand anywhere else on Elwood Beach.
