The Friends of Suai (FoS) scholarship program helps students from low-income families to gain the education they need to secure employment, thereby improving their quality of life and that of their families.

The benefits also extend beyond the individual scholarship recipients. Graduates are also contributing to their communities by sharing their skills and knowledge to provide vital services including education and health care.

2024 scholarships

The Friends of Suai scholarship program, facilitated by the Covalima Community Centre (CCC), is fully funding scholarships for five students at Baucau Teachers College. This includes two students who are close to completing their fourth year to attain the Licentiate (Bachelor of Education).

Vocational scholarships have also been awarded for certificate courses in General Construction (one student) and Motorbike Mechanical training (two students).

FoS is also continuing to provide financial support to three students in the process of completing their post-graduate studies in Community Development at the National University in Dili.

In addition to tuition fees, all scholarships include contributions towards living and travel expenses, graduation costs and pastoral care by the Education Coordinator at the CCC.

Graduation ceremonies

In 2023, Emanuel and Meliana completed their third year of study at Bacau Teachers College. Their formal graduation ceremony was held on 16 March 2024, and both have been awarded a Bachelor of Teaching. Emanuel was awarded a Certificate of Academic Distinction for achieving the highest academic results in three years of study, and he gave the student response to the guest speaker at the ceremony.

Both students are continuing their studies this year to complete the Licentiate (Bachelor of Education) and have recently completed their three-month teaching placements in Covalima.



Four young women completed the Certificate II in Hospitality at the Canossian Vocational Training Centre in Suai and graduated on 14 December 2023. Two of the graduates are now employed in Suai.

One student successfully completed the 12-month Certificate in Automotive at Don Bosco in Dili and the graduation ceremony was held in April.

All tertiary and vocational courses provide students with extensive practical placements which allow them to utilise their skills in a workplace environment. This is a great way to prepare them for future employment.

Employment for Midwifery graduates

Elsa and Jenia, two of the qualified midwives who graduated in April 2023, now have paid employment as nurses and are working at health posts in their home sub-district of Zumalai in Covalima district. They are two of six young women who were offered FoSC scholarships to train as nurses as the National University in Dili and continued on to complete their post-graduate studies in midwifery.

Odelia graduated in November 2023 and she is now employed by an NGO called Frontline, to provide maternal and child health services in Dili and Bobonaro district.

Congratulations to all of these young women. Their skills will be of immense value to the community.
